These events are for the Canberra community so bring your friends and family along!





Free plants to new landowners!

If you've purchased a residential block of land in Taylor/Whitlam, you can get FREE plants.

For almost 100 years, Yarralumla Nursery has provided free plants to new landowners, known as the Plant Issue Scheme.

It helps you establish a sustainable garden with plants suitable for our climate and soil conditions while beautifying your home and suburb.

Lids4Kids in Whitlam

Did you know that anything smaller than a credit card can't be recycled through our kerbside recycling?

That's where Lids4Kids comes in. This grass-roots organisation started in Canberra several years ago running out of Tim Miller's garage. It went viral when people across Australia began collecting lids to turn into prosthetics, sending them by the container to Tim in Canberra. They now collect anything from blister packs to bread clips to lids!

Today they have a depot in Fyshwick where people of all walks of life volunteer time to help sort and shred lids and turn them into recycled plastic products including their famous bench seats! You can meet them and learn about how they sort plastic at the coming Care, Share, Repair event on 16 March.
